- Division 1 to be increased to 11-a-side in 2024 and then up to 12 as in pre-Covid days the following year.

A number of potential rule changes were discussed too and there could well be a brand new singles competition come September - a Thursday Division Merit – with a potential sponsor to be approached!

So it's going to be good to see everyone again early next month and with so much to mull over.

I have to admit it's been strange not having to prepare for regular monthly meetings but, via the website, Facebook posts and this Newsletter, I hope member clubs and their bowlers feel the League is doing its best to communicate.

Recent posts on the website include good news on the thorny issue of parking for Trench as they countdown to their Centenary Celebrations on the Sunday of the August Bank Holiday weekend.

I hope to be involved in some way with that special day – and it won't be too long before the League gets to 100 not out!
