I've seen plenty of MSBL bowls on Friday nights already in the 2025 campaign - in glorious dry and sunny weather it has to be said for a change - and it has been great to see so many bowlers enjoying the evening and the camaraderie it brings.

Fortunately, for our greenkeepers, the dry spell has ended, but it can only have helped the entry numbers for all our competitions to date, which have been marvellous. Now your officers are hoping for a good day and decent turnout at Edgmond for the Senior Merit finals this coming Saturday 31st May (2pm start).

On the personality front, the League is still without a vice-chairman and my approaches to a couple of people have so far not borne fruit. There is also chairman Sean Round's stated wish to stand down at the 2025 AGM, but I know lots of people are trying to get him to change his mind. He has grown into this role so well over the years that he is going to be a mighty hard act to follow. He leads the team with great aplomb . . .

Nominations for Life Members for 2025 will be taken up until the July executive meeting and then confirmed that night.

He may not get nominated for that honour but there is one man who has helped me tremendously since the start of the year - Phil Owen, who started bowling for Madeley Miners and is now a Sir John Bayley stalwart.

The gaps in the League's records and honours board have annoyed me intensely since being elected into this role in January 2011 and, despite planning to try and put things right every single winter since then, I've never actually got round to it.

But having finally contacted Shropshire Archives for advice and then appealing for help, Phil has been my knight in shining armour.

He helped me sort out the early paper records that had been stored in my attic and his brilliant work researching newspaper cuttings going back to the League's launch in 1932 has been nothing short of sensational. There won't be any excuses for gaps very soon. The League and I owe you big time Phil.

And with so many cuttings now to hand thanks to Phil, Sean has had a brilliant idea for the League to launch a mini museum where they and the various artefacts gathered over the year can be displayed for posterity. Clubs willing to become home to this display should contact me - and there is already one that could be interested . . .

Another person we owe a huge debt of gratitude to is Pauline Wilson. She addressed delegates at the March meeting on the general subject of recruitment of new bowlers of all

ages. She accepted the invitation to speak after John Lumsden had proposed late last year that the League try to produce a more formal Youth Development programme.

Having just resumed duties as County Development Officer, Pauline is convinced that the only way forward for clubs to recruit new bowlers long term is to have a qualified coach in their ranks.

This is a view the League fully endorses so we are giving full support to the level 1 coaching course she has set up this summer, when the practical sessions are to be held at Shifnal. The full details can be seen on various posts on the MSBL website and the deadline to sign up to it is 31st May. Please clubs, don't miss this great chance on your doorstep - it can only help your long term futures.

The start of June is Shropshire inter-league time with an incredible 3 teams heading for Old Shrewsbury on Sunday the 8th with Brenda Slingo and newcomer James Blair at the helm. Then on Saturday the 14th it is veterans time at Meole Brace with captain Ian Evans busy finalising his squad. Who knows, if I can find enough over-60 bowlers willing to represent the League I may just try and run a second team myself that day . . .

Let's just hope that we have silverware to receive after those competitions that we can show off in style at the League's annual presentation dinner.

I'll end with a big plug for that evening, which will be held on Friday 14th November at a new venue of The Shropshire golf club in Muxton.

We have listened to feedback from clubs - changing the venue so as not to be reliant on outside caterers; starting at the later time of 6pm (meal at 6.30); reducing the price for juniors who attend; and opting to book a live music act in the form of the fabulous Harmony Sisters.

However, I must give clubs and bowlers early warning that we are limiting numbers to 140 that night and we expect there to be a big demand. The choice of a 2 or 3 course meal will be decided at the July meeting and then the price per person can be worked out.

But clubs and bowlers are really going to have to be on the ball come the end of the season as everything will need to be sorted a month in advance of the big night. The October meeting is going to be crucial!!!!

But for now, enjoy the season and hope to see lots of you at Edgmond.
